
2020 Sustainability Report

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

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Ever take a few minutes after visiting one of our locations and maybe start up a conversation with your friends and family, or even just think to yourself, "Wow, they sure carry a lot of merchandise in that store, I wonder where it all comes from?"

We all know that we can't grow bananas or mangos in Saskatchewan nor can you grow Douglas Fir trees for some of our lumber needs. The products that you find in our locations come from all four corners of the world; Asia, India, Europe, the United States, and of course, Canada. Want to know where else?

SASKATCHEWAN! That's right. Hundreds of products that we sell to you the member are grown, produced, manufactured right here in Saskatchewan! Our Food Stores stock locally produced meats and fresh fish as well as produce items like potatoes, cabbage, corn, and tomatoes, all sourced from local producers. Our Home Centres sell dimensional spruce lumber from local saw mills, locally produced live edge lumber and log siding, and locally crafted back yard furniture and ornaments. Lake Country Co-op C-Stores, Cardlocks, and Bulk Petroleum departments fuel our trading area with product from our Co-op Refinery in Southern Saskatchewan!

Our Agro Centres source locally grown bulk cereal seeds like wheat, barley, oats, and peas and in turn sell these to growers within our trading area. As well, our Liquor Stores stock wines, spirits, and beer from approximately four dozen Saskacthewan distilleries and vendors.
